Samphoas HUY received her Ph.D. in Global Affairs at Rutgers University in May 2024. Inspired by the work of the Khmer Rouge Tribunal and of Civil Parties, who bravely recounted the history of atrocious crimes under the regime, she conducted Master's and PhD research on gender justice in vernacular which focusses on victims' empowerment, treatment of gender crimes and women's contributions in transitional justice and peacebuilding and also the roles of civil society organizations in the processes of empowerment.
